

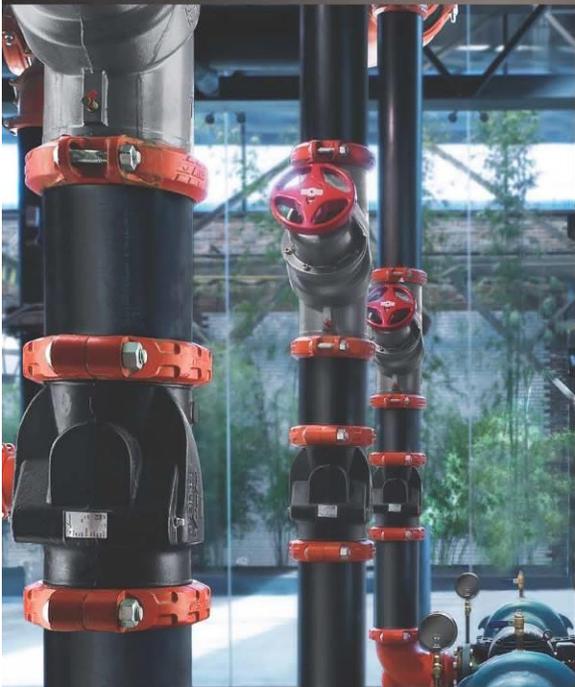

**A Tour of a Winery**

Back in March I received an E-mail from Nicole Wilson, Bucks PSPE Chapter President, inviting me to a tour of Sand Castle winery, located along the Delaware River 12 miles north of New Hope in Bucks County. Joanie and I decided to go. Besides expectations of drinking various squeezings of the grape, we hoped to learn about something outside of our comfort zone.

Around 20 members and guests attended the presentation given by co-founder and co-owner Joseph Maxian. Joseph put winemaking into historical perspective, giving the Romans credit for introducing winemaking to Europe.

The winery is located on 72 acres on the plateau east of the Delaware, and has a spectacular view of the Bucks County and New Jersey countryside.

The first thing we learned about winemaking was its complexity. Joseph brought wine growing experts from Europe, even before the ground was cleared, to advise on soil preparation and vine selection. The enterprise started in 1974. A total of 15,000 ft. of drainage pipes were installed. The land was planted with cover grasses such as

sorghum and rye grass for a couple of years, which was then plowed under. Twenty tons per acre of cow manure was added.

Joseph explained that European vines such as vinifera produce good wines, but their roots are destroyed by various bacteria in American soil. American grapes such as Catawba or Concord don't produce good wines, but are not affected by the bacteria. The solution? To graft vinifera stems to American roots. The juncture is the 'knot' on the vine. The grafted vine grows for one to two years in a nursery before it is planted into the soil! Grapes are produced three or four years afterwards. The winery produces four tons of grape per acre.

The complexity of wine making was clearly explained by Joseph in an easy and humorous manner, which added to a pleasant evening.

Collecting the grapes, squeezing them, other preparations, etc. are pretty much automated. Yeast is added so the juice ferments. Red wine is made from red or black grapes fermenting with

their skins. To make white wine the juice is fermented without the skins.

The wine is stored in barrels made from French oak, then blended to produce the finished product.

We were treated to thirteen different wines with an explanation as to how they are produced and what foods augment their flavor. There was a plate of cheeses, chocolates, strawberries, and salami with instructions as to how to eat them and what wines to drink with them. Chocolates with wine? Who knew?

Unfortunately, their wines are not for sale in Pennsylvania's Wine and Spirits stores. They are available at the winery and stores in Warrington and Phoenixville.

We thank Nicole Wilson and Joseph Maxian for a very pleasant and informative tour.
